



Australian Bobath Neurodevelopmental Therapy Association Paediatric Foundation Course Application

Course Aims

This interdisciplinary course is designed to:

1. Provide an overview of the current theoretical background to the Bobath/Neurodevelopmental Therapy approach to the treatment of the child with cerebral palsy, through the study of neurosciences, syndrome classification, principles of assessment and treatment.
2. Provide initial practical and clinical experience in Neurodevelopmental therapy handling, assessment and management of children with cerebral palsy.
3. Develop awareness of factors involved in problem solving and communication in all aspects of the treatment context, including the child, the parents, the therapists and the health and educational teams.

Course Objectives:

The course participant will be able to:

1. Discuss current knowledge of neuro-anatomy, neurophysiology and neuropathology and relate this to children with cerebral palsy.
2. Apply the principles of normal and abnormal development to the management of children with cerebral palsy.
3. Apply an understanding of sensori-motor development and normal movement development to the treatment of children with cerebral palsy.
4. Identify features of different types of cerebral palsy, and classify children with cerebral palsy.
5. Develop skills in assessment and analysis of problems of children with cerebral palsy.
6. Develop skills in effective application of handling techniques.
7. Plan rational and integrated programmes of management and develop skills of analytical clinical decision making.
8. Design home programme, educate and instruct parents and carers.

Members of the ABNDTA Instructor Group, New Zealand Association and Bobath Centre will present lectures and demonstrations for the application of the Bobath approach. This seven week course will be split in two parts. Course hours are from Monday to Friday with one-two Saturdays between the hours of 8.30 am to 5.00 pm daily. During the course, the participants will be assessed on their written work, practical work and verbal presentations. Participants are expected to engage in self-directed study during the course and in the break between Part 1 and Part 2. Full time attendance is required to attain the standard.
